Key Race of the Day – Race 7 – Starter Optional Claiming – About 7 Furlongs (TURF)

The final race on the card is an interesting and competitive turf event at about seven furlongs. While #6 J P Hellish is clearly the horse to beat, we'll try to get a little creative here with **#3 Fast and Ready** at 10-1 on the morning line. It's clear from his past performances that he prefers turf and synthetic over the dirt and last year, he scored a big upset over this course at 18-1, which was at today's distance. After that, he was a game third in the Puss N Boots, a race that was a clear jump in class for him. Looking at those two solid efforts, he'll need the pace to develop for him to make his run, and he may need a race to get into form, but at this price, he's worth a long look. As mentioned, **#6 J P Hellish** is the horse to beat – he had a very successful winter at Turfway Park, winning two of four starts. He never finished worse than fourth and finds himself against a group that he should be able to handle with ease. At what figures to be an extremely short price, could the distance cause him issues? Maybe it ends up being a little short for him, but he also is handy enough to race from wherever. The real thing to consider with him is his price as we approach post time. **#7 Mannix (IRE)** is a new face here at Fort Erie and goes out for owner/trainer Gary Chudobiak. His form late last year left something to be desired, but his summer form was quite strong – this gelding showed on the grass that he can race from a variety of spots and today, it looks as though he might be able to secure a more forward position, which could play in his favor. Like Fast and Ready, the price should be right.
